#### Addressing Ethics and Best Practices in Supervision (6 CE Hours) Presenter: Dr. Toni Tollerud

This workshop will focus on professional ethics and best practices that are critical for counselors, social workers, and other professional therapists/clinicians who work in a school or clinical setting as supervisors, or who receive supervision. It is the responsibility of supervisors, and the art of supervision, to help insure that professional therapists are effectively equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to deliver competent and ethical services. It also emphasizes the responsibility of the profession to protect the welfare of every client. Supervision is an integral part of training and continuing education for professionals. This workshop will review supervision best practices by providing current information, review policies and procedures, and highlight intentional interventions for supervisors. This will include ethical and legal concerns for planning the supervision sessions, building a strong supervisory relationship, assuring informed consent, documenting supervision sessions, and evaluating supervisee progress.
